Any person or group of persons acting in concert who directly or indirectly contribute \$1,000 or more in support of or in opposition to a change of organization or reorganization that has been submitted to Calaveras LAFCO must comply with the disclosure requirements of the Political Reform Act of 1974 applicable to local initiative measures to be submitted to the electorate. These requirements contain provisions for making disclosures of contributions and expenditures at specified intervals; they may be reviewed at Government Code §§56700.1 and measures to be presented to the electorate can be obtained by calling the Fair Political Practices Commission at (916) 322-5660. A LAFCO Commissioner must disqualify herself or himself from voting on an application involving an "entitlement for use" (such as an annexation or sphere amendment) if, within the last twelve months, the Commissioner has received \$250 or more in campaign contributions from the applicant, any financially interested person who actively supports or opposes the application, or an agency (such as an attorney, engineer, or planning consultant) representing the applicant or other participant in a LAFCO proceeding to disclose the contribution amount and name of the recipient Commissioner on the official record of the proceeding.

- 5. Correspondence: Support Letter for SB 1209 Indemnification. Mr. Benoit informed the Commission that the Court in San Luis Obispo County ruled that LAFCO's can't be indemnified. It is currently in the legislature to allow LAFCOs to be treated fairly and be indemnified.
- 6. Bylaw Amendment amending section 4.6(a) regarding changing the month for the election of the Chair and Vice Chair from the May meeting to the January LAFCo meeting.
 - a. Consider Resolution 2024-0007 amending bylaw Section 4.6(a) regarding changing the month for the annual election of the LAFCo Chair and Vice-Chair. Mr. Benoit summarized previous discussions regarding changing the election date for the Chair and Vice Chair from May to January.

- 7. Biennial Review of Calaveras LAFCo's Conflict of Interest Code
 - a. Review LAFCo's Conflict of Interest Code. Mr. Benoit stated that there are no recommended changes and suggested authorizing the Chair to sign the COI. A Resolution will be brought back at the next meeting for approval.

- 8. CALAFCo Conference Items.
 - a. Calafco Annual Conference Tenaya Lodge Fish Camp Oct 16-18, 2024. Review Reservations and Lodging. Mr. Benoit reported that any cancellation requests can be refunded if requested by October 1st. After that, registration can be transferred to another representative.
 - b. Discussion regarding presentation regarding service provision to districts not subject to LAFCo's jurisdiction. Mr. Benoit informed the Commission that Mountain Oaks Charter School is interested in being annexed into the San Andreas Sanitary District; however, they will have to request annexation from San Andreas Sanitary.

He continued that he will be giving a presentation at the Annual Conference on this subject.

- 9. Executive Officer's report
 - a. Status of upcoming Service Reviews. Mr. Benoit announced that the Commission had received the President's Special Acknowledgement Award from SDRMA for not having any claims in the past five years. He spoke of a recent letter from the Calaveras Planning regarding a proposed project in San Andreas for a 70 room hotel, nine residential units for the staff and a restaurant. An unmitigated impact must have an EIR regarding wastewater levels associated with the project as it is anticipated to generate approximately 1,400 gallons of wastewater per day which is above the capacity that the San Andreas Sanitary District can manage.

Next, he reported that MSRs are done every five years, so it's usually found after the fact that districts are underperforming. As for the upcoming Municipal Service Reviews, he will meet with the City Manager to get their MSR moving and hopefully, the Lighting Districts will have a draft ready for review at the next meeting, followed by the Veterans Memorial Districts and Cemetery Districts.

Lastly, he informed the Commission that he received a call from the County Assistant Auditor asking why LAFCo contracts with the City for services and replied that the Commission was dissatisfied with the service, the fees were too high and the County seemed to make up the rules as they went along. Additionally, the County had wanted the Commissioners to be employees of the County, which was not legal.

10. Commissioners Reports.

Commissioner Smith reported that he had a meeting with all fire chiefs regarding upcoming reviews and impacts on them from the change in dispatch. He stated that rural districts used to have lower insurance rates. Previously, rural fire was always relied on, but now CalFire is always there. This could impact future funding. CalFire is the largest fire program in the world. There may be a time when local fire is duplicated and may be deemed unnecessary.

Chair Moncada adjourned the meeting at 6:55 PM.

The Commission may, at its own discretion, meet at a different time or place from time to time, provided that public notice of such time and place is given in accordance with the Ralph M. Brown Act, Government Code Section 54954 et seq. and applicable provisions of the LAFCo Act.
